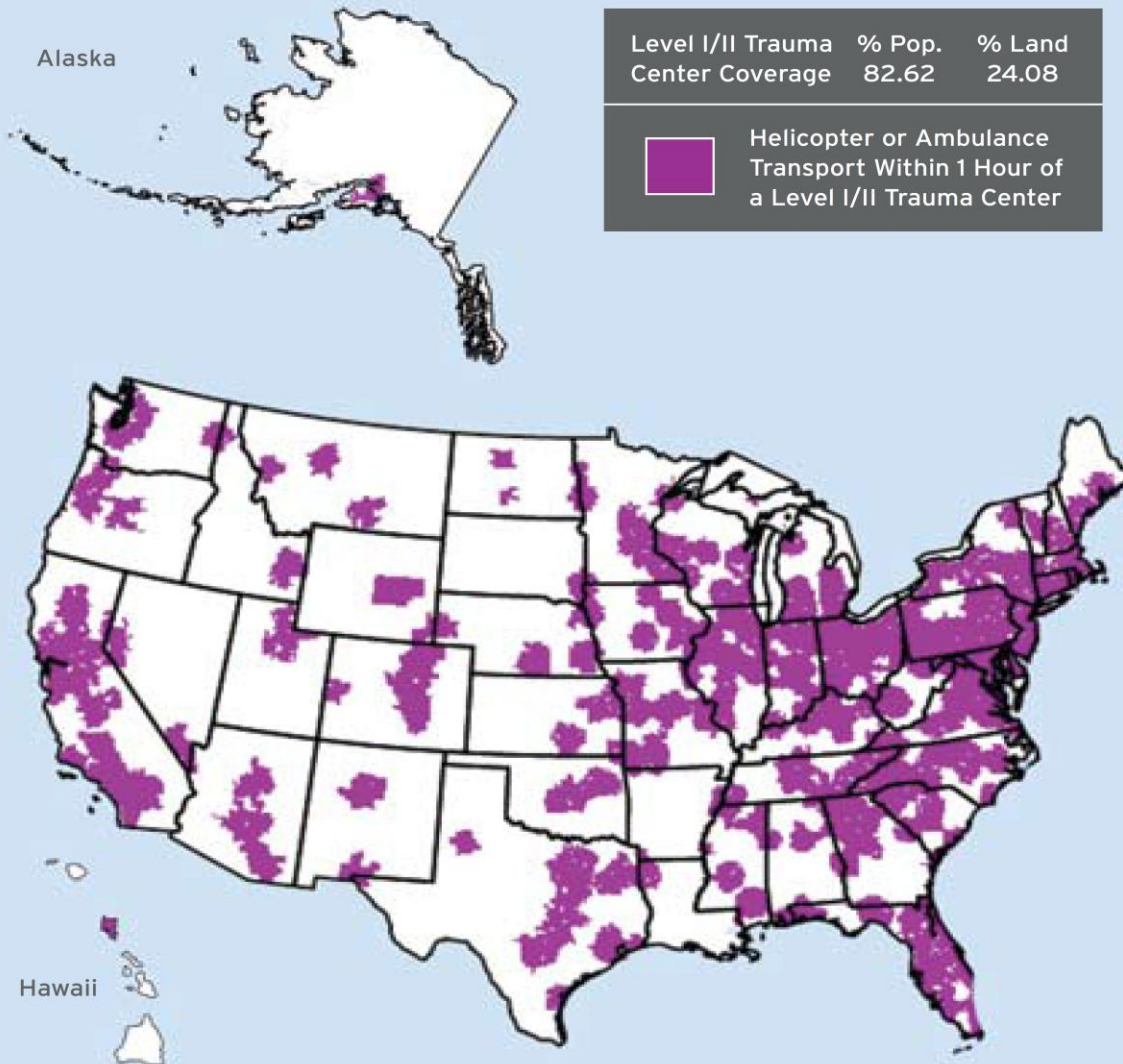

Access to Trauma Centers

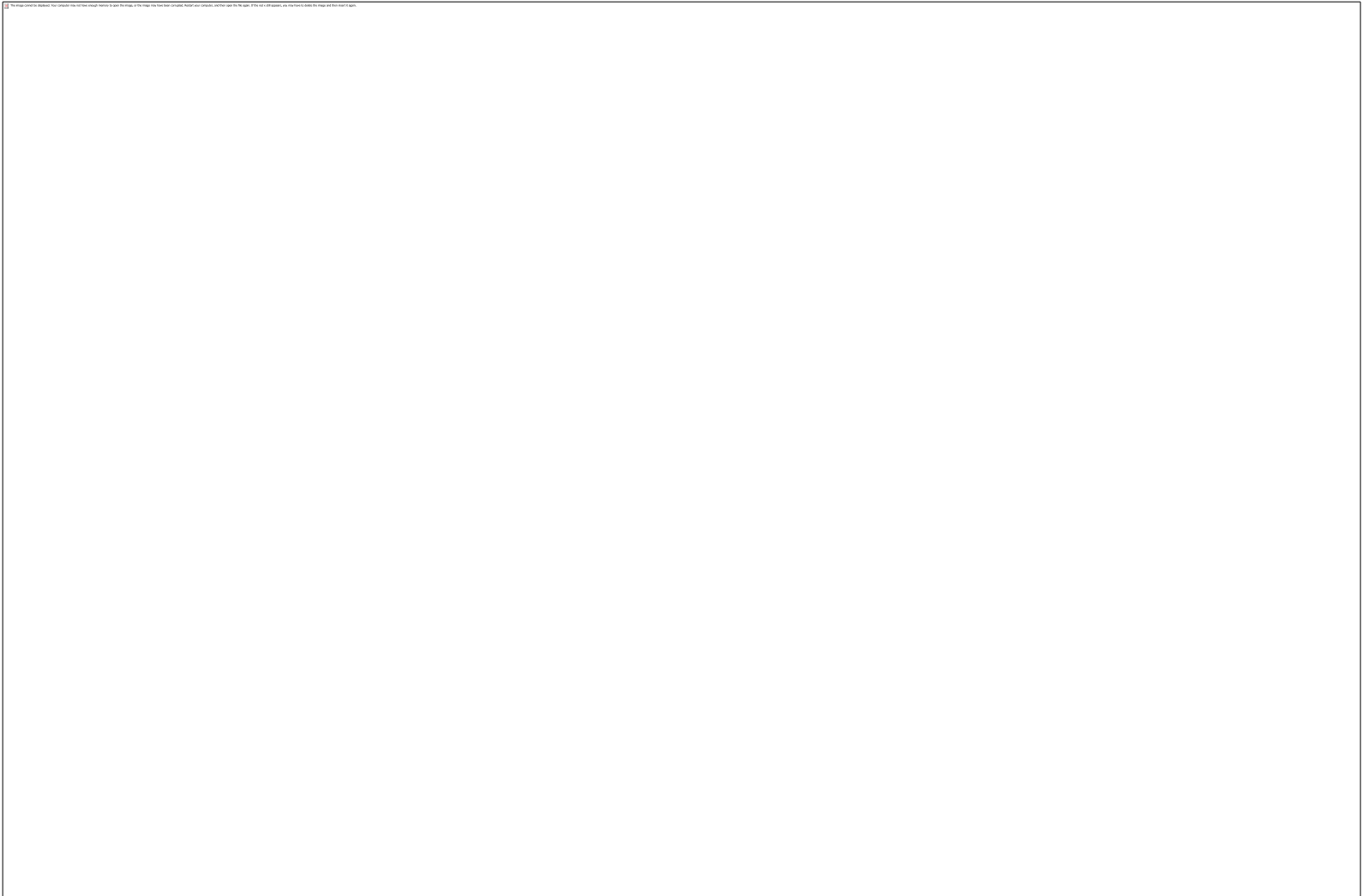


Nearly 45 Million Americans DO NOT have Access to a Level I or II Trauma Center within One Hour.

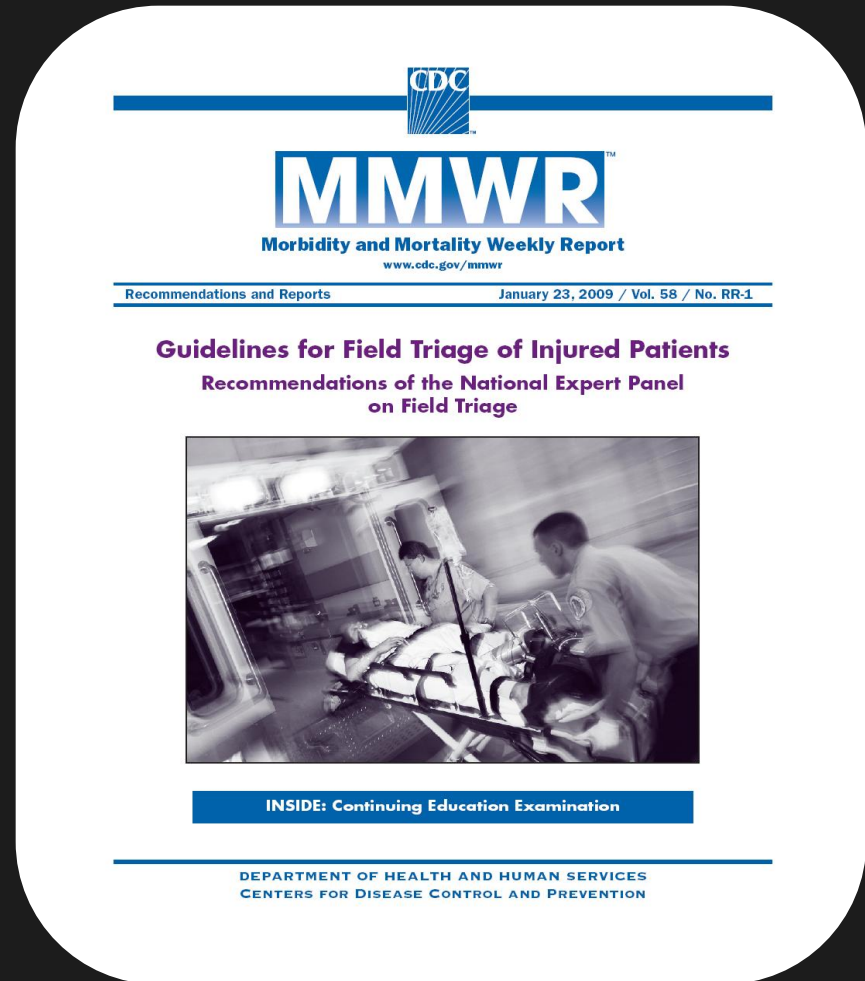

Field Triage Decision Scheme

- Successes to Date:
 - Launched in January 2009
 - Approximately 35,000 Web hits
 - 48,000 copies of *MMWR* and field triage materials disseminated
 - 1,300 people have taken the continuing ed. opportunity
 - Special issue in *JEMS* in July 2009
 - 47,000 copies distributed
 - Webcast with 1,000
