1. NASEMSO Signs Letter Supporting STOP Stroke Act

On April 10, 2007, The STOP Stroke Coalition, including NASEMSO, sent a letter to Senators urging them to become a co-sponsor for S.999, the Stroke Treatment and Ongoing Prevention Act (STOP Stroke Act). The STOP Stroke Act would help educate the public about the need to treat stroke as a medical emergency and establish coordinated statewide systems of care so that all stroke patients have access to the latest and most effective treatments and therapies. 2. NASEMSO Supports Pandemic Flu Funding

On April 11, 2007, the Working Group on Pandemic Influenza Preparedness, including NASEMSO, sent a letter to Appropriations conferees in support of the House-passed funding level for pandemic flu contained in the FY 2007 Emergency Supplemental. The letter urged Congress to act immediately and include the House-passed total of \$1.02 billion for pandemic preparedness activities within the Department of Health and Human Services, as well as \$13.2 million for the Department of Interior and \$161 million for the Department of State's pandemic activities, in the final version of the emergency supplemental. 3. Federal Communications Commission Announces Agenda for First Responders Summit, April 20, 2007

On April 10, 2007, the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC) Public Safety and Homeland Security Bureau (PSHSB) announced the agenda for the "First Responders Summit: Focus on Public Safety Communications" on Friday, April 20, 2007. The meeting will be held at FCC Headquarters in Washington, D.C. in Room TW-C305. The summit will include expert panels composed of representatives from the public safety community, government and the communications industry. The summit will close with a roundtable discussion on key issues related to emergency preparedness and response. The three-expert panel discussion includes: Federal Government Programs and Initiatives for Public Safety; Disaster Communications Planning for First Responders; and New Technologies and Applications in Emergency Communications. The summit is open to the public; however, admittance will be limited to available seating. Tuesday morning includes: general sessions with updates on EMS education standards, public access defibrillation, pandemic flu planning, EMS and disaster planning; briefings from Federal EMS officials (DHS Office of Health Affairs, NHTSA, CDC Injury and Disability Outcomes and EMSC); and more. 6. NGA Center Launches Pandemic Outbreak Workshops to Enhance State Readiness

On April 10, 2007, the National Governors Association (NGA) Center for Best Practices, in partnership with the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), convened officials from the upper-Midwest in the first of a series of regional workshops designed to assess and enhance overall state and regional pandemic preparedness. State, local and private sector officials from Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Minnesota, Ohio, and Wisconsin engaged in a variety of exercises, including a "tabletop" simulation, to improve communications among state, federal and local agencies; examine existing response protocols; and identify effective strategies for ensuring that states can continue providing essential services to their citizens when confronted with a pandemic. The next workshop will be held in Scottsdale, Ariz., May 21-23, and will include state officials from American Samoa, Arizona, California, Guam, Hawaii, Nevada, and the Northern Mariana Islands. 7. Fire Grants Application Period Ends May 4

After several weeks' delay, the application period for the Assistance to Firefighter Grant program opened March 30, 2007. Fire departments and nonaffiliated emergency medical services can compete for a share of the \$492.3 million available. The application period ends May 4, 2007. The Homeland Security Department issued final guidance, and potential applicants are encouraged to review the materials at <http://www.firegrantsupport.com/docs/2007AFGguidance.pdf>. The operations and safety program allows first responders to purchase equipment and personal protective equipment. The funds also can be used to implement training, establish wellness and fitness programs, and modify stations. The other AFG

program helps departments and EMS organizations purchase vehicles, including ambulances and fireboats.

Emergency Medical Service Week, May 20-26, 2007, brings together local communities and medical personnel to publicize safety and honor the dedication of those who provide the day-to-day lifesaving services of medicine's "front line." 10. GAO Releases Report on First Responder Interoperability

GAO has released "First Responders: Much Work Remains to Improve Communications Interoperability." According to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS), \$2.15 billion in grant funding was awarded to states and localities from 2003 through 2005 for communications interoperability enhancements. This funding, along with technical assistance, has helped to make improvements on a variety of specific interoperability projects. However, states that GAO reviewed had generally not used strategic plans to guide investments toward broadly improving interoperability. 12. Rapid Response Was Crucial to Containing the 1918 Flu Pandemic: Historical Analyses Help Plan for Future Pandemics

The historical analyses of the 1918 flu pandemic are part of an ongoing effort called the *Models of Infectious Disease Agent Study* (MIDAS), which is supported by NIH's National Institute of General Medical Sciences (NIGMS). Through MIDAS, researchers have developed computer models to examine how a future pandemic influenza virus might spread and what interventions could minimize the impact. A second study shows that the timing of when control measures were lifted played a major part in flu containment. Cities that relaxed their restrictions after the peak of the pandemic passed often saw the re-emergence of infection and had to reintroduce restrictions. The results of the systematic analyses of historical data to determine the effectiveness of public health measures in 1918 are described in two articles that have been published online in the journal, *Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences*. 14. CNIC Prepares for Upcoming Hurricane Season

Hurricane Season, beginning June 1 and running through Nov. 30, is approaching and the need for accountability and safety of personnel is a Commander, Navy Installations Command (CNIC) top priority. CNIC has joined with Fleet Forces Command (FFC) in Norfolk to participate in Hurricane Exercise 07 (HURREX 07), a full-spectrum event testing installation and family disaster preparedness from Texas to Maine – and all states and installations in between. The exercise will be divided into two parts. The first part, the tracking and warning phase, will be conducted from April 23 through May 4. The second phase, requiring personnel accountability and family assessment, will be conducted April 23 through May 9. The HURREX phases will consist of four artificially constructed tropical systems that will develop and intensify to hurricane strength, threatening the Caribbean, East Coast and Gulf Coast regions.
