1:45 – 2:30 pm		<p><b>Skills Guidelines</b></p> <p><i>Morgan Scaggs (Chair Elect, KY)</i></p> <p>For the past 10 years, the EMS for Children Program has ensured the EMS practitioners have the appropriate equipment in their ambulances to serve the pediatric population. The new set of performance measures now requires that EMS practitioners practice the necessary skills to care for their patients. Therefore, the council will explore the best way to develop a guidance document that recommends processes to check these skills.</p>

3:00 – 4:30 pm		<p><b>Emergency Preparedness: Kansas State Highlight</b></p> <p><i>PECC Regional Leads</i></p> <p>We all know that pediatric patients present their own set of barriers and challenges in emergency medicine. Add the chaos of a mass casualty incident and we have a true pediatric disaster. Through this presentation, we will look at how Kansas presents JumpStart triage to prehospital care providers, who needs to be at the table for a statewide pediatric disaster plan, resources for educational purposes and the importance of tracking measurable outcomes during those training sessions. Though all states have their own approach to disaster preparedness and some prepare for different types of disasters, we can all agree that every disaster affects our pediatric population and it is time for everyone to have a plan in place.</p>
